	 A community challenge that was shared is finding qualified teachers in childcare learning centers and being able to pay them appropriately. On this same topic, it was also noted a challenge is also for parents to find quality childcare. Data was shared from a recent webinar hosted on the different implications of federal legislation that could impact factors like food insecurity, childcare workforce, low-income and target populations who receive Medicaid, and foster care impacts. Additionally, the partners discussed extensively the housing crisis and where they could go to connect the families they served. It was noted Camillus House provides compassionate services including housing, healthcare, job training, and support for individuals and families experiencing homelessness in 	
	Miami-Dade County. It was also share health plans could be a great resource to possibly help with housing assistance.
