	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SNAP/ EBT benefits for the month of November 2025 may be at risk due to current Federal government shutdown which may lead to increased food insecurity. The Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) has sent out a notice to share information on resources for those affected. The following link to DCF with information and resources was shared in the chat: https://snap.myflfamilies.com/. • Cristina B. shared that as of November 1st, Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), a federally funded nutrition program, may also be affected by the government shutdown. She shared that United Way Miami will be announcing community initiatives addressing food insecurity. 	
Presentation: <i>Health Literacy Understanding & Using Communication Skills</i>	EIC partner, Shannon Charles, MPH, Director of Advancement & Community Relations at Epilepsy Alliance Florida, gave a 15-minute presentation, <i>Health Literacy Understanding & Using Communication Skills</i> . The presentation was focused on health literacy for the older adult population. Health literacy is defined as <i>the ability to understand basic health information in order to make appropriate health decisions</i> . Factors such as complex health systems, multiple medications, chronic conditions, age-related changes (hearing, vision, cognition), can all have an impact on health literacy and the ability of older adults to manage chronic illness. Older adults (65+) are at the highest risk for low health literacy, and misunderstandings can lead to medication errors, missed appointments, poor disease management, and increased hospitalizations. Mr. Charles reviewed the principles of clear communication such as using plain language, and the <i>teach-back method</i> . Shannon Charles email is SCharles@eafli.org .
