	medication that helps with low blood pressure from losing blood after getting to the hospital. They	
	are doing this research to see if giving these medications earlier on in care will improve outcomes

They help people that live at home with home healthcare services or seniors (age 55+) that live in assisted living facilities. The goal is to offer preventive care.
