Member Spotlight	This month's member spotlight was for Michelle Fundora from Health Choice Network (HCN), a health	
Presentations	center-controlled network that provides services for health centers. HCN started in 1994 with 5 health centers	
	(e.g., CHI, Jesse Trice Community Health Center, Family Health Center Southwest Florida, and Camillus	
	Health Concern) that came together to improve services for health centers and the patients that they serve	
	and has now grown to 35 health centers under the network currently. Most of HCN's health centers largely	
	serve the Medicaid population and heavily depend on funding from the federal government. HCN provides	
	advocacy for patients by fighting to get funding to continue providing services to patients. Services include	
	financial billing services, billing support, quality services to improve patient quality and care, and electronic	
	health record support, which allows researchers all over the world to gather data from underserved,	
	underrepresented populations and improve healthcare overall for everyone. HCN uses their funding to	
	provide these services not only to the health centers under their network, but also to health centers that want	
	to contribute and participate within the funded program to learn, improve, and compete to be the best
