Welcome and Introductions	The monthly meeting of the Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade Children Issues Committee was brought to order by Alina Soto at 10:10AM. All members were welcomed and introduced themselves.	
Approval of Minutes	There was a motion to approve the May 2015 Children Issues minutes by Dr. Natale; the motion was seconded by Alfie Leon.	
Strategic Plan	Alina briefly discussed the Partnerships to Improve Community Health grant (PICH). The Children Issues committee focus is on nutrition and physical activity. The committee will partner with the Early Learning Coalition's fall summit. This will be held on September 19 th . After the summit, CI committee will reconvene and see what can be planned for the next year. Tier 2 would be an invitation to the child care providers for additional technical assistance. The centers will be designated as Healthy Happens Here upon completion of the program. The benefits offered to them will be designed. Family homes are included in the initiative. This initiative has adopted a new name: #We Learn Healthy. The committee will teach healthy habits, nutrition and incorporating math, science and literacy. The subcategory is Healthy Eating and Active Learning. Break out session took place and teams were divided into Healthy Eating and Active Learning. During the summit, there will be presentations on these areas.

How do we impact 246 centers a year?

- The group discussed have quarterly summits and partnering with agencies that are already meeting, for example, The Early Learning Coalition.
- Reaching out to Little Havana and Miami Gardens that just received grants on healthier communities on identifying child care facilities that are interested in the initiative.
- There should be a second step to implementation. This would be the implementation of Tier 2: technical assistance.
- Having virtual meetings. Set up a free Go To Meeting and also have monthly conference calls. On the call, have an expert and champion who is already doing good things in their facility to give others encouragement to move forward.
- Have facilities talk barriers and what they are doing to overcome those barriers.
- The program will be based on Caring for Our Children standards for policies placed already (physical activity, a beverage, snack and screen time). The committee would like to include additional components such as breastfeeding and oral health.
- What is the impact focus: child care facilities. The goal is to have system level changes in child care facilities and policies are being implemented.
- Make sure there is a standardized training component (modules).
- Resources to entice providers: CEUs, coolers for stored breast milk.

Active Learning Team

- Create a document of resources for the providers assessing the health of their center. The goal is to show centers what they could be missing out on.
- Assessment of the centers need to be conducted.
- Services should not be duplicated. Provide a toolkit with various components (i.e. safety, mental health).
- Not losing out on centers that may have services.
