They are experiencing a delay due to some issues with creating a healthy bread recipe.</li> <li>Los Ranchos Steak House- 4 locations are enrolled. 	<ul> <li>GP~ provided the Healthy Hub updates for Kendall Baptist Hospital: 259 clients visited in the month of March. Out of the 259 clients, 165 had clinical findings. Ages ranged from 15-90 years old. 63% female, 37% male, 92% have primary care and have visited their doctor within the past 12 months, 13% referrals were given out for primary care to follow up.         <ul> <li>Returning client's blood cholesterol improved significantly, upon her follow up visit, blood cholesterol results went from 320 to 220.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>NM- provided Health &amp; Wellness Center in Liberty City updates:</li> <li>56 clients were seen in the month of March, 56 Journey to Wellness RX were given out, 7 referral were given out and 12 clients have committed to return for their follow up visit.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Dr. Tran~ provided the Green Rx updates:</li> <li>Promotion of the Green Rx are taking place in local health fairs.</li> <li>A challenge with the Green Rx has been the cost of incorporating the prescription in the client's medical records.</li> </ul>
