Previous Action Items	David Saltman explained how the Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade works and what the Elder Issues Committee does. "You just need an interest in helping elders to be a member in this committee."	
Performance Measures in Need of Improvement	Our goal is to have consistent attendance of our members. We are developing an internal survey to improve our membership. We need representation from the Long Term Care community. We also need representation from the elder community. We need a letter of introduction for the Elder Issues Committee and we would like to have a meeting in an alternative location. The survey will be finalized by the next meeting. Mayra Garcia summarized the projects done by FDOH-MD for the PICH grant over the last 3 years. Performance Measures were taken from the Work Plan (Make a Survey, make an

Presentation on Healthy Happens Here by Leyanee Perez	Leyanee Perez summarized the success of Healthy Happens Here (The Healthy Restaurant Initiative). This PICH initiative assists restaurants to offer healthy meals to the public by providing meals which are under 500 calories, are low fat, low cholesterol and low sodium. 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

The restaurants who incorporate the healthy selections in the house menu do well. To sustain this program, restaurants will pay a fee for this service. Isabel Rovira presented on the Age Friendly Initiative. Our older adult population is growing and will be 20% of the Miami-Dade County by 2040. We have many community partners. The Age Friendly Initiative works with county government to make plans to make buildings, roads and parks age friendly. An Age Friendly business area was established where elders can walk to and stay physically and socially active. The work plan is based on built environment to build infrastructure to get elders more actively involved in the community. WHO has a network of Age Friendly communities. Miami-Dade has several of these communities. Age Friendly Ambassadors program is being developed by United Way to spread the world. A survey to update the action plan was distributed to our members who are 55+. Surveys will be done via telephone by AARP, the paper surveys are in English and Spanish and are being distributed in many areas of Miami-Dade County. The results will be given to Miami-Dade Commission for review. To become and Age Friendly community the town or city needs to promise to work toward this goal. There is work being done in several states to promote the Age Friendly Initiative, and the focus is shifting toward considering the needs of elders when constructing streets, buildings, parks and any other public facilities.
