New Business	The committee discussed each item on the action plan. To clarify, the organizations under the "person responsible" category, are the organizations who are currently working on the deliverables under that task. The following are updates (in relation to breastfeeding) from organizations within the Taskforce. WIC Update • Access to breastfeeding and information: Breastfeeding courses and training, WIC one-on-one, breastfeeding education. Partnered with Healthy Start Coalition of Miami-Dade (HSCMD). • Breastfeeding resources/support: Provide deluxe packet for breastfeeding mothers, lactation support, provide breast pumps and aides. Recent funding allowing WIC the opportunity to purchase more breast pumps. Extra funding is helping to eliminate the waiting list for moms returning to work or school. Medicaid can also provide breast pumps. • Social marketing is ongoing through WIC outreach program. Community resources, three media programs at Breastfeeding Awareness Walk, partnered with HSCMD, free radio interviews (97.3, 105.1, FIU radio show, and 102.9). • Support in workplace: Education and training. Suggestion: add other community members who are also assisting with support in the workplace. For example, Healthy Start. • Support in early care and education: Multiple meetings through Early Learning Coalition and United Way. WIC is partnering with both the Early Learning Coalition and United Way to help childcare systems. WIC is planning an educational training through Early Learning Coalition sometime in September. Quality Counts is the organization that increases the standards and regulations in the childcare centers. WIC partnered with Dr. Shameka (director of Family
