

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




Overview of	- From the addressing infant mortality in Miami-Dade County discussion at the March	
CONNECT and	meeting, Rebekah Antoine and Manuela Thomas from the Healthy Start Coalition of	
the FIMR Project	Miami-Dade (HSCMD) presented on the Connecting Families to Communities Program	
of Miami-Dade	(CONNECT) and the Fetal Infant Mortality Review (FIMR) Project.	
Presentation	- An overview of the goals of HSCMD's were shared with the Taskforce. They include to	
Tresentation	reduce infant mortality, reduce the number of low birth weight and pre-term births, and	
	improve maternal and child health developmental outcomes. Their work aligns with the	
	goals of the Healthy Baby Taskforce.	
	- The FIMR process was reviewed. It includes surveillance, review, determining the root	
	cause, and preventative action steps. The 2018 FIMR case review findings and	
	recommendations were shared. In 2018 there were 26 cases reviewed.	
	- Key contributing factors that were identified from the 2018 FIMR cases that were	
	reviewed. These include a mother's medical/obstetric history, medical conditions (like	
	obesity, chronic diseases), socioeconomics, family planning, and knowledge and	
	compliance of prenatal care visits.	
Old Business	- The Healthy Baby Taskforce (HBT) shared the approved online brochure with the	
	members. The online brochure, Breastfeeding A Parent's Guide, will be posted by	
Online Brochure	June 1 st , 2019 on the Consortium's website.	
	- The Taskforce continued the discussion on indicators 3.6 and 3.8 from the Action Plan

	- From the workplan Indicators 3.6 and 3.8 are not on schedule. The Taskforce discussed	Baptist,

	- Indicator 3.6 Create links between local maternity care facilities and community	<mark>nurses</mark>
	breastfeeding support networks. The Taskforce continued to discuss attending meetings	
	that are hosted at birthing facilities like La Leche League International and other partners.	
	- Indicator 3.8 Educate OB/GYNs on the importance of breastfeeding and informing their	
	clients of the breastfeeding benefits and resources. Recommendations by the members	
	included bringing up specific questions to the doctors that would help influence better	
	birth outcomes. It was mentioned that the Social Determinants of Health drive birth	
	outcomes too.	



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	 Queen Holden shared best practices that were used to help achieve Indicator 1.1 Educational sessions with medical professionals to promote awareness and responsibility of utilizing the High-Risk Pregnancy Notification and Newborn Exposure Notification which may be able to help with the success of Indicator 3.8. She shared that a meeting was held with UM Jackson Main Hospital. They shared with them a written protocol they had created to better educate on the process. Rubi Garcia from the Maternal Health Committee in Broward shared with the Taskforce a toolkit they created to educate and use when they visit OB/GYNs. The toolkit includes a letter in the beginning from a Champion OB/GYN and other articles about influencing better birth outcomes. It was also shared that they do targeted outreach like targeting OB/GYNs with high cesarean rates. A key takeaway from this discussion was that the physician's office staff are the first ones to receive this information and then pass along to the physician. It was also noted to consider best times to meet with physicians like hosting dinners or courses with incentives like offering CEU credits. 	
Partner Updates	 Committee members were able to briefly announce their current work/initiatives/projects.
