Old Business South Florida Hispanic Chamber of Commerce: Community Engagement Award	The Consortium received the Community Engagement Award on Friday, June 28 <sup>th</sup> , 2019 from the South Florida Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and the Hispanic Women's Society Network. The Consortium was well represented at the "The Lavender and Lace Luncheon". The Executive Board discussed upcoming future meetings to be hosted at various locations in the community to invite senior leaders to our meetings. The Board discussed that having meetings at different locations in the community was a great idea to raise awareness and recruit new partners to the Consortium.	
Walker Tracker Update	Leyanee Perez provided a brief update on the Walker Tracker. The launch date for the Walker Tracker Challenge will begin on September 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2019. The first sixty days will begin implementation of the program. The program will serve 3,500 participants. The Health Promotion and Disease Prevention (HPDP) Committee will be the lead for this initiative. The target population for this initiative has not yet been identified. It was discussed that if participants were not active users, they would be removed, and we would be able to add new users to participate.
