Approval of Minutes	There was a motion to approve the October 2020 Healthy Baby Taskforce meeting minutes by Cheryl Lorie, the motion was seconded by Candice Schottenloher.	
Previous Action Items Presentation: <i>Birth Equity in Miami-Dade: What Does it look like?</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - During the September meeting for National Infant Mortality Awareness month the Taskforce had a presentation from the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County on <i>Birth Equity in Miami-Dade: What Does it look like?</i> - During the November 2020 meeting, the Taskforce followed up on any remaining questions from the presentation. The Taskforce had a brief conversation on how their organization has been addressing health equity and having these important conversations. It was also highlighted the importance of sharing health equity and cultural competency trainings with healthcare providers. - Esther McCant shared about Think Cultural Health from the Department of Human and Health Services. This resource was shared as a tool for us to learn more about CEU and educational

For more information please visit https://thinkculturalhealth.hhs.gov/.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Taskforce during the November meeting reviewed the draft of the Healthy Baby Taskforce Social Media Toolkit. The Taskforce toolkit team shared an update that the toolkit will be created for organizations and partners to educate, bring awareness, and share with the community the importance of maternal child health and reduce infant mortality. - The contributing partners present during the meeting who provided feedback for the toolkit included: DOH-Miami-Dade HIV Perinatal, DOH-Miami-Dade OCHP, DOH-Miami-Dade WIC, Health Council of South Florida, Healthy Start Coalition of Miami-Dade, ICU Baby, Jessie Trice Community Health Systems, Kreative Concepts, Metro Mommy Agency, and Sunshine Health. - The team reviewed the <i>Mission, Vision, Goals, Objectives</i>, and each of the theme sections. These sections were updated during the meeting with the recommended changes from the members. It is important to note that how the data is pulled from Florida Health Charts is how the information will be referenced for race and ethnicity. Other sections it was noted to include mother as birthing parent and/ or women of color to be more inclusive. - The team shared they would like to have all items submitted to the liaison by Thursday, December 9, 2020 to compile into the toolkit to review a final draft at the January 2021 meeting. - The team suggested for the <i>Fast Facts</i> section to create this data into an infographic to allow the audience to easier capture this data. It was shared to create facts that also included local data for Miami-Dade County. This would make it more personal and bring more attention to the local issue. - Lastly, partners signed up for any remaining sections that were not completed. It was also shared they could share a social media post about their organization to include in the <i>Local Resources</i> section of the toolkit to educate and link the community back to their services.

It was highlighted that last year the major changes to the work plan was the addition of the Tobacco Cessation and Resources section. - The Taskforce liaison provided an overview of the Taskforce Work Plan.
