She also provided an update related to the current COVID-19 vaccination efforts. She shared the role of DOH providing vaccines to various providers in the community. We have joined efforts with the county to give vaccine appointments. Currently the vaccine is being distributed to priority populations like the elderly population of those aged 65 years and older and to front-line healthcare workers.

The goal for this toolkit is to also decrease the infant mortality rate in Miami-Dade County and Florida.
