Previous Action Updates Committee Meeting Survey Review SWOT Analysis Activity	<p>Barbara Martinez-Guerrero shared with the Health and the Built Environment Committee the committee meeting time survey results. A total of five members completed the survey. Based on the feedback received, the current committee meeting time of the second Tuesday of the month from 10:00-11:00 AM bi-monthly still works best for most of the committee members.</p> <p>The SWOT analysis activity was sent through Survey Monkey for the committee to complete after the January meeting. This was designed to help evaluate the status and work of the committee. Candice Schottenloher shared the SWOT analysis activity results that was collected from the survey responses from the committee members.</p>	
Performance Measures in Need of improvement (Work Plan Review)	<p>During this meeting the Health and the Built Environment Committee highlighted Health Equity, Goal 3, Objective 1 as a performance measure from the work plan in need of improvement. This activity measure highlighted was: By September 30, 2024, the Health and the Built Environment Committee will conduct a SWOT analysis and review the results annually. The committee liaison led the <i>Health and the Built Environment Committee SWOT Review Activity</i> using Poll Everywhere. This activity captured the committee members feedback from the SWOT analysis to discuss opportunities and areas for improvements to the committee. The following four questions were included in the activity.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.) From the results of the SWOT Analysis, which factors do you think the committee should focus on to improve the committee? 2.) What are some ways to bolster and engage the Health and the Built Environment committee members activity? 3.) What are some opportunities and project ideas for the committee to participate in the community? 4.) What are some ways to increase committee membership and meeting interests? <p>After the activity Barbara Martinez-Guerrero briefly discussed the committee's 2019-2024 workplan. She shared from this important conversation we will create actionable steps for the committee. From this feedback we will identify top themes as a priority for the committee. Some of the ideas that were shared from this conversation included the theme of mobility and access, the Underline, Friends of Flagler Trail and Ludlam Trail, Miami Loop presentation, Access to Biscayne Bay, and water access plans.</p>	

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Recognition of Improved Performance	<p>During this meeting the Health and the Built Environment Committee highlighted an activity from the committee work plan as a recognition of improved performance. This activity was Access to Care, Goal 2, Objective 2: By September 30, 2024, the Health and the Built Environment Committee will review a minimum of two indicators at each of their meetings. The committee has reviewed or accomplished two objectives at every meeting since the creation of the 2019-2024 workplan.</p>

In January they had the Safe Streets Summit that was hosted with Miami-Dade, Broward, and West Palm Beach NPOs in partnership with Urban Health Partnerships. He also shared TPO is currently working with the FDOCs Bicycle Network Assessment and the Department of Transportation and Public Works on the new Mayor’s Initiative on pedestrian safety too.</p> <p>Daniel Padilla – He shared an update they are still working on a pollution study on the Miami River with the University of Georgia. They are currently defining where the study is going to take place.
