- **DOH-Miami-Dade WIC:** Carla Sabugo shared an update on the fruit and vegetable cash voucher for WIC participants. Beginning June 1, 2021, the WIC program will be increasing the cash voucher to \$35 per participant and will end on September 30, 2021. It is important to note it does not apply to infants; it is for all women and children 1 to 4 years old. Cheryl Lorie provided an update that they have created an alliance along with the Kiwanis of North Dade World's Greatest Baby Shower and the Children's Movement as they plan for August as Breastfeeding Awareness Month.
- Early Learning Coalition of Miami-Dade/Monroe: An update was provided by Tatiana Larionova. She shared the coalition will have a soft opening for the offices starting in June. She shared they still have not visited their childcare centers, partners, and partnerships. All childcare centers are currently offering in-person services. She also shared today they will be hosting a food demonstration. Lastly, she shared the next Early Headstart school year will begin on August 1st and they are looking for eligible children 0-3 years old to sign-up for this program. Please share and refer.
- Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County: Candice Schottenloher provided an update to the committee. She shared the updated COVID-19 Testing & Vaccine Community List will be shared via email with the committee.
- Florida International University: Claudia Pinzon provided an update to the committee. She shared they are partnering with the Children's Movement of Florida to promote continuing education on breastfeeding. She shared more details will be shared once the date is finalized.
