	collaborations with other Consortium committees. This activity is highlighted in the	
	HBE work plan which states, "By September 30, 2020, increase opportunities for	
	collaboration through the Health and the Built Environment committee). There have	
	been conversations shared about cross-collaboration among committees at the	
	Executive Board level. A future opportunity that was discussed was to work with the	
	Worksite Wellness committee as they will create a community garden by utilizing a	
	worksite space that is not necessarily being used now. During this meeting, it was also	
	highlighted the HBE committee could develop a community gardens map of Miami-	
	Dade County.

	that may be interested in applying, to address equity, issues within communities related to
