Welcome and Introductions	The Tobacco-Free Workgroup was brought to order by the Chair, Dr. Richard Thurer, at 9:32 am. All members were welcomed and introduced themselves.	
Review and Approval of Minutes	The minutes from the Tobacco-Free Workgroup meeting held on November 16, 2020 were reviewed. No changes to the minutes were noted. Guadalupe Barroso made the motion to approve the minutes and Cristina Matheus seconded the motion. Members of the Tobacco-Free Workgroup unanimously approved the minutes from November 16, 2020.	
Partner Updates	Dr. Gwynn noted the Florida Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics formed an e-cigarette taskforce to encourage policy change at the state and federal level. They hope to educate Pediatricians on issues and to participate in prevention and education.	
Executive Board Update	• The Executive Board met on January 11, 2021 where the results of Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade elections were shared. Dr. Thurer and Bill Amodeo were reelected as the Tobacco-Free Workgroup Chair and Co-Chair, respectively. The Consortium Directory was shared, and it was noted if members need to update their information, they should do so by updating their membership information on the Consortium's website. Committee Chairs were also reminded all committees should be working on items in their workplan.	
Previous Action Items	<ul> <li>Subcommittee Updates</li> <li>Tobacco-Free Environments Subcommittee – Subcommittee Chair Guadalupe Barroso and Nikki Chuck provided an update on plans for the upcoming Tobacco-Free Workplace Summit. The event will be held on February 26, 2021 virtually via GoToWebinar. Event information will be shared via email and partners were asked to promote the event.</li> <li>AHA School Tobacco Policy Community Dialogue – Lacy Boyles provided an update on the American Heart Association (AHA) School Tobacco Policy Community Dialogue held on December 16, 2020 which provided an overview on the need for comprehensive and supportive K-12 School</li> </ul>	



	tobacco policies. AHA along with the Tobacco Prevention and Control Program are working together to assist the school district with revising their policy. The goal is to have it completed for the new school year.  • Brief discussion was held on nicotine addiction treatment for minors. It was noted that there are no guidelines for treatment and providers generally use what is used for adults. It was also noted there are plans in motion to create a youth cessation program through the Bureau of Tobacco Free Florida and AHEC. More information will be provided to the partnership about the program when received.  • Policy & Surveillance Subcommittee — Dr. Bailey provided an update on the drafted op-ed. The subcommittee will work on updating and trying to get the op-ed published. The next subcommittee meeting will be held after this meeting and the subcommittee will be working on a county tobacco retailer license.  • FDA Deeming Rule Update was provided to the partnership by Islamiyat Adebisi.  • Legislative Action Updates — John Michael Pierobon noted SB 334- Smoking in Public Places was assigned to a committee. Members were encouraged to contact Senator Brodeur to schedule the bill for an immediate committee hearing. Its companion bill, HB 239 is also scheduled to a committee. Members were encouraged to contact the Chair of the Professions & Public Health Subcommittee, William Robinson, to schedule the bill for a committee hearing. It was also suggested the partnership encourage local cities and the county to pass a resolution to make beaches smoke-free.  • Members were informed a meeting of the Coalition of State Coalitions will

Recognition of Improved Performance	• The committee discussed progress made to achieve workplan item under Health Equity - By September 30, 2024, the committee will work to identify and invite diverse partners to the Tobacco-Free Workgroup (TFW). To date, the Tobacco-Free Workgroup has made contact with and presented to the Live Healthy Miami Gardens ATOD Subcouncil, Gang Alternatives and the Urban Partnership of Miami-Dade County Coalition. With these efforts, the partnership has been able to successfully recruit key stakeholders to support local tobacco prevention and control efforts.
