- **Arts A L, Inc.:** An update was shared by Marie-Carmelle Lindley. She shared they have partnered with one of the schools and their afterschool program where they are going to be working with the kids by teaching them how to dance and educating on proper nutrition. She shared on May 28th, 2022 they will be working with a park in the Homestead area.
- **Banyan Health:** An update was shared by Zulema Santacruz. She shared they continue to work on a few special initiatives. She shared the Maternal Health Program is working with young women who are at-risk and connecting them to behavioral health support. Another effort is the care coordination model that includes several team members that are doing outreach and connecting with potential patients to link them to care through scheduling appointments and understanding their barriers to access to care.
- **Buddy System MIA:** An update was shared by Kristin Guerin. She shared they are a young non-profit. They have a homebound food access program primarily for those who are either disabled or elderly. She shared they also have the Community Fridge Initiative that has 10 community bridges across the city and have monthly events at each of them and about three of our locations are almost entirely children and families. The newest fridge just recently open in the Allapattah community too.
- **Colgate BSBF:** An update was shared by Cristiane Rocha. She shared Colgate BSBF has resumed in-person events as well as the mobile unit to do dental screenings in the community.
- **Department of Children and Families:** An update was shared by Jeffrey Hurst on the Back-to-School event that will be hosted with Together for Children on Saturday, August 13, 2022. Flyers will be shared and sent to the committee. He also shared another event that he attended related to teen violence and the importance of creating an opportunity and safe space for the children and families to connect to community. Gilda Ferradez also shared they are also working on the substance and newborn efforts to try and get services to those moms in need of care. Additionally, they are working on their hurricane preparedness plans too.
