

Previous Action	The Healthy Baby Taskforce reviewed the final draft to approve the baby safe sleep community survey.	
Items	The purpose of the community survey is to help us gain a better understanding of how our community	
	views safe sleep practices. The questions we would like to address include:	
Baby Safe Sleep	1. What is the existing perceptions and attitudes towards safe sleep?	
Focus Group	2. When and how are expectant parents/new parents receiving safe sleep information?	
Follow-up	3. Is the information received effective? Are new parents implementing safe sleep practices?	
Discussion	The Taskforce reviewed the final draft and provided final recommendations to include in the survey. The	
	survey was approved with the included changes that will be updated in Survey Monkey. All feedback	
	was noted. It was also noted to not remove any questions. It will also be translated into Spanish and	
	Haitian Creole. The survey will be disseminated into the community by this summer.	








Healthy Corner	Tenesha Avent and Candice Schottenloher shared brief updates on the Healthy Corner Store Initiative

	for breastfeeding. It was also shared this palm card could be disseminated to the community if created in	
	time at the Bounty of Health Summer Bash Health Fair on Saturday, August 27th, 2022. Additionally,	
	Florida Impact would be happy to meet with the interested Taskforce members to brainstorm ideas for	
	what a pilot project would look like in Homestead. Lastly, Tenesha Avent shared March of Dimes is	
	planning to create a pop-up grocery market to offer fresh and high-quality foods for about 200 families.	
	For this initiative logistics are still being planned and will be shared as they become available. For those

New Business	Candice Schottenloher, Healthy Baby Taskforce Liaison, presented to the Taskforce the Florida Healthy	
	Babies new FY 22-23 Work Plan Updates. Each County Health Department (CHD) must create a	
FHB FY 22-23	workplan that includes a minimum of two Florida Healthy Babies priorities. In Miami-Dade County we	
Work Plan Updates	will focus on Infant Mortality and the Broad Social, Economic, Cultural, and Environmental Factors also	
	known as the Social Determinants of Health. For each priority area the updated and new work plan	
	strategies were shared. It was highlighted in this new work plan there will be a strategy for the first-time	
	addressing climate and environmental factors that are linked to birth outcomes impacting pregnant people	
	and expecting families.	
Partner Updates	Taskforce members were able to briefly share an update on their current work/initiatives/projects.

	2022. The December meeting has been canceled as members will be on holiday vacation.	
	- DOH-Miami-Dade WIC: A few updates were shared by Cheryl Lorie. She shared August is	
	National Breastfeeding Month and World Breastfeeding Week is hosted from August 1st to 7th every	
	year. The first Saturday of the month is also always the Big Latch On event throughout the world.	
	Cheryl shared the Big Latch On event this year will be hosted in-person at Doral Legacy Park on	
	Saturday, August 6 th , 2022 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Flyers were also shared with the Taskforce. - Green Cars for Kids: An update was shared by Candice Schottenloher on behalf of Catherine Toms.	
	They are preparing for the launch this fall of the pilot program for Green Cars for Kids in Miami	
	Dade County. We are looking for hospitals, clinics, Community-Based Organizations (CBOs),

	- Healthy Start Coalition of Miami-Dade: Heather Baker shared a few updates with the Taskforce.	
	Treating State Countries of Filmin Batte. Retailed Batter shared a few apautes with the Taskrofee.	







She shared the coalition currently will be at a total of 4 events over the next month. She shared they will be at the 11th Annual WIC Breastfeeding Awareness Family Day, Tree of Life Community Baby Shower, Commissioner Joe A. Martinez - Health and Safety Expo, and the Children's Trust Family Expo, the central event. She also shared they will be distributing the QR code flyers at all events and project to distribute approximately 1,000 flyers between those events. She also shared they are currently working with Sunshine Health to purchase car seats and portable cribs for the families that are in need and participating in the Healthy Start program. More updates will be shared once this collaboration is finalized. Another update that was shared is some of the home visiting Healthy Start staff will attend a 20-hour breastfeeding counselor course over the next few months. There are a couple of courses that are becoming available. They are excited to be able to have staff that are conducting visits with families go and receive the information so they can then disseminate additional information and support further education among their clients. Lastly, she shared the Connect Team is now providing bedside services at Jackson West in addition to 6 other birthing hospitals in Miami-Dade County. They are now at a total of 7 birthing hospitals out of the 13 hospitals in Miami-Dade. They are also providing bedside services at 7 of the hospitals. Most of the Connect services are telephonic.

- **Human Rights Watch:** An update was shared by Skye Wheeler. She shared about importance of trainings being available to doulas with a focus on climate change and maternal health. She shared New Orleans is currently working on a training and believes there is opportunity for Miami-Dade to lead on these efforts. More details will be shared for anyone interested in this training.
- **ICU Baby:** An update was shared by Candice Schottenloher on behalf of Leah Jayanetti. She shared to Save the Date for the 2nd Annual Hope Parade Walk on Saturday, November 6th, 2022. More details will be shared as available.
- Jessie Trice Community Health System: An update was shared by KeTia Harris. She shared a few upcoming events with the Taskforce.
