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<p>Executive Board Update</p>	<p>Executive Board met on July 11, 2022.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tobacco Free Workshop <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Governor Ron DeSantis signed legislation to authorize municipalities to abolish smoking in parks and beaches. ○ Smaller parts of the county and some states will not consider this work, but Miami-Dade County might consider abolishing smoking in parks and beaches • Mental Health Summit <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The executive board is organizing a mental health virtual forum to be held on September 16, 2022, from 9 AM-12:45 PM. This topic ties back to the Executive Board workplan under the Access to Care and Injury/Safety/Violence priority areas. ○ The topic selected for the Health and the Built Environment committee is <i>How urban design shapes our mental health</i>. ○ More information on registration will be going out soon. • CDC COVID-19 & Health Equity Grant <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Dr. Bethel provided an update to the Board on the awardees for the Intent to Award for the latest RFAs. She provided there is currently a total of 36 contracts. ○ The awardees are all addressing social determinants of health in Miami-Dade County that are being caused due to COVID-19. ○ The awardees must complete quarterly reports to document their goals and ensure that quality assurance is being met to have a sustaining impact in the community. 	
<p>Workplan Review</p>	<p>Courtney and Barbara shared the current progression of the Maternal Child Health and Chronic Diseases objectives on the HBE workplan as outlined in the Cascade reporting system. DCSR provides free urgent care, a street medicine team, a mobile crisis response, and a disaster relief team for zip codes within a 5-mile radius of the Miami Medical Campus, including Liberty City. • Chronic Diseases <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Educate and raise awareness of the benefits of health, lifestyles, and health promoting environments. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Urban Impact Lab has drafted guidelines in alignment with this goal's committee measure. ○ Increase adoption and implementation of policy, systems, and environmental changes in creating healthy communities. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Courtney commented collaboration through a new community garden with Office of Community Health and Planning once opened and possibly with Green Haven Project in Overtown. ▪ Cynthia mentioned West Kendall Baptist Hospital's community garden program, Grow 2 Heal, that holds events to promote health and engagement within the community. ▪ Joanna had an idea about linking the committee's future Underline event with Grow 2 Heal, Urban Green Works, and other community gardening and fresh food groups. The study focuses on using a smartphone app to better interact with intersection crossing which lessens the likelihood of accident occurrences.</p> <p>Dream in Green: Barbara Martinez-Guerrero shared that through this year's school program, new lessons are being developed and topics such as the urban heat island effect will be included. Alternative transportation will have a special emphasis in the new lessons as the students will be focusing on the Design and Build Competition with a theme of how government centers will look in the year 2100.</p> <p>West Kendall Baptist Hospital Cynthia Mejia shared information on West Kendall Baptist Hospital's safety fair on September 3rd from 9 AM-1PM. The fair will include various organizations informing the community on topics such as water safety, fire safety, and heat safety. They are currently in the process of creating flyers. Cynthia will share more information as it becomes available.</p> <p>Center for Multicultural Wellness and Prevention (CMWP) Johanne Celestin shared that CMWP is currently working on a financial literacy pilot program to educate high schools.
