This training also aligns with the work plan activity: By September 30, 2024, the Children Issues Committee will create an educational awareness campaign to increase engagement in the free breakfast program at Miami-Dade County Public Schools and the Summer Food Service Program.

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- **American Heart Association:** An update was shared by Robert Hill. He shared February is American Heart month, so AHA wanted to collaborate with Healthy West Kendall on offering some of these conversations related to the dangers of tobacco and vaping. He also shared they have a couple of mini grants available and one of them is specifically related to hunger relief. He shared there will be an info session on January 30th, 2023 and if you are interested in learning more to please contact him for more details.
- **Arts A L, Inc.:** An update was shared by Marie-Carmelle Lindley. She shared they will be hosting a free Dance Workshop for ages 3 and up on Saturday, January 21, 2023 from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- **Department of Children and Families (DCF):** An update was shared by Jeff Hurst. He shared there will be an upcoming provider meeting on Thursday, February 16, 2023 at Miami-Dade College Kendall Campus. He also shared about his involvement with Together for Children as he is the Chair of the Strengthening Family component for the Goulds, Perrine and Richmond Heights areas. He shared he is planning an event in this area and would be interested to work with other partners to support this initiative. She shared 2023 will be the planning phase and in 2024 we will begin to carry out the assessments to help us develop our community plans.
- DOH-Miami-Dade WIC: An update was shared by Eriko Robinson. A recap was shared on the success of the 9th Annual Homestead/Florida City WIC Holiday Health & Resource Fair that was hosted on Saturday, December 10th, 2022. There were over 1,500 registered guests for this event. Over 800 toys and over 1,000 books were distributed and almost 700 families received groceries from Farm Share. An important update was also shared the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program in Miami-Dade County is experiencing an increase in caseload and demand for services. An email update was shared with the partners too.
- **Florida International University:** An update was shared by Melissa Howard. She shared an update on the BreastfeedMIAMI Collaborative which hosted the Milky Way documentary screening at FIU. She shared it was a great success and they are looking to host another screening event in the community.
- **Healthy Start Coalition of Miami-Dade:** Heather Baker provided updates on behalf of the coalition. She shared they continue to operate with Healthy Start visits with a hybrid model. She shared they are still able to operate in this manner because the public health emergency was
