	Leyanee both were able to attend a roundtable discussion on food insecurity on behalf of the	
	Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade. They also learned about what other community	
	partners are doing to address food insecurity too. The Mayor is also interested in launching an	
	initiative too related to food insecurity. The Board also discussed the importance of volunteers	



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	and potential volunteering opportunities they could share with some of the Miami-Dade County Public Schools our partners are working with to help with food rescue efforts. Additionally, two other upcoming food distribution opportunities were shared and include a food distribution at Miami Central Senior High on Saturday, March 18, 2023 and a March of Dimes Pop-up Grocery Experience will be hosted this Sunday, March 19, 2023 from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. at the Oak Grove Community Center. There is a lot of work being done to address this issue of food insecurity and will continue to be discussed.

She provided an update on the Healthy West Kendall - Virtual Heart Health & Tobacco Cessation Presentation for Schools that reached 220 middle school students. She provided survey results from both the pre and post-tests. These included a 48% pre-test score and 79% post-test score. There was an increase in knowledge from these presentations. 97% found the presentation to be valuable. These trainings were in partnership with Healthy West Kendall, American Heart Association, Tobacco-Free Workgroup, and the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County's Tobacco Prevention and Control Program.
