

	County having its first Chief Heat Officer. Other key stakeholders that should be a part of this conversation also include the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department too. More updates will be shared on this report as it becomes available.  This work aligns with the new work plan strategy: Promote and support action-oriented community processes working with groups to bring awareness of the important climate and environmental impacts linked to birth outcomes for pregnant people and expecting families.

Safe Sleep Survey	in Miami-Dade County. This presentation provided an update on the status of the <u>Baby Safe Sleep</u>	
Status Update	Community Survey the Taskforce designed and launched back in October 2022. Jessica Mulroy reviewed	
Presentation	the current survey responses and results. To date, there have been 29 responses, and only 8 surveys	
	completed. She also shared from the response rates the demographic information to give context of who is completing the survey. It is also important to note we have not reached the Creole-only speaking	
	population yet. Candice Schottenloher presented on the current community efforts that have been taking	
	place since the launch of the survey. Based on the data and the community efforts, the Taskforce had a	
	discussion on how to further disseminate the survey as well as suggested modifications to allow for more	




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	survey responses. From this discussion, there were two polls launched regarding the current survey responses. It was voted by the members to tailor our outreach efforts with not expanding our eligibility window and removing the yes/no question about how I put my baby to sleep. Further updates will be discussed at the next meeting.	
Partner Updates	Taskforce members were able to briefly share an update on their current work/initiatives/projects.  DOH-Miami-Dade WIC: An update was shared by Candice Schottenloher on behalf of Cheryl Lorie for August events for National Breastfeeding Month. Please see updates under New Business.  Florida International University: An update was shared by Okezi Otovo on the Black Mothers Care Plan (BMCP): Black Maternal Health and Birth Equity Workshop, which was hosted on Saturday, June 3rd, 2023, and they are looking to host another one of these workshops in the fall. Recently, hosted on Saturday, June 10th, 2023, the BMCP Supportive Trauma Informed Care Community Workshop at the YWCA of South Florida Intergenerational Center in Miami Gardens. As mentioned, the trainings are led by our partners who are practicing doulas and midwives which gives an opportunity to talk through both the landscape of Black maternal health in the United States and the types of care models that they utilize to optimize the experiences and the outcomes for Black birthing persons. She shared with a particular kind of emphasis on helping clinical and hospital-based providers to improve the delivery of care and for our community leaders to understand that kind of care continuum that includes those of us who do not work in medical sites. As workshops are hosted the details will be shared with the Taskforce.  Healthy Start Coalition of Miami-Dade (HSCMD): Ana Maria Rodriguez shared that their Fatherhood State-wide Initiative – T.E.A.M. DAD has officially begun taking referrals. Services are being provided in English and Creole. They are still seeking a Spanish-speaking staff member. The program provides education regarding fathering skills, relationship and communication skills and personal health.  ICU Baby: An update was shared by Leah Jayanetti. She provided an update on the NICU Empowerment Support Tools. Currently, she shared the three hospitals (Jackson, Holtz Children's Hospital, and South Miami Hospital) already have the journal and guidebook to
