Leaders were able to discuss doula care and the need to be better recognized and better compensated for their work in addressing inequity and maternal and newborn health. There is a meeting coming up with the Mayor Levine Cava to present findings and discuss pushing legislature to make all insurance companies and Medicaid pay and compensate for doula care. 	 Queen Holden, DOH-Miami-Dade Perinatal HIV Coordinator, shared updates on her work and how the Taskforce has been able to help assist her clients with available community resources. Beverly Montgomery shared the importance of the Taskforce voice and being able to have a stronger voice to be able to advocate at the legislature. It was noted by Leah Jayanetti to look outside of our partners and other partnerships that could play a role in Maternal Child Health. For example, Dr. Okezi Otovo with her work in the Department of History and African and African Diaspora Studies Program. Other areas could be in biology, climate work, and law. It was also noted to include Transportation as a partner at the table and is such a barrier some of our clients face to seeking services. Leah Jayanetti mentioned looking into Brightline connections for possible grant program. Green Cars for Kids is another partner for vehicle solutions for mothers. Esther McCant also shared a new strain and concern in the Northeast end of Miami-Dade of a well-used bus route that is going to change which could affect mothers who are disproportionally disadvantaged and at high risk of infant mortality. 	
Partner Updates	 Taskforce members were able to briefly share an update on their current work/initiatives/projects. Healthy Start Coalition of Miami Dade (HSCMD): Heather Baker informed members of great opportunities that they are working with some wonderful organizations. The HSCMD was one of the many proud Sponsors for the 12th Annual Breastfeeding Family Awareness Day, Tree of Life baby shower, and the upcoming ICU Baby Hope Parade. She also shared about the Connect Program, triage system that connects families to home visiting and other services in the Miami Dade County, have also added an additional hospital providing on-site services which began on September 5 of 2023. Additionally, Heather Baker shared that Sunshine Health has funded a community grant of \$10,000 to the Healthy Start Coalition of Miami-Dade County. Funds will be used to purchase portable cribs and car seats for families who cannot afford those items. Jessie Trice Community Health System: Our Village is a free weekly on-site parenting education program for prenatal families and families with children 0 to 2 years of age. This program will launch sometime in October and November, dates to be announced. Still in enrollment phase, if you know of potential partners who could collaborate, please contact KeTia Harris. Flyer to be posted and shared with members in next meeting. Breastfeeding Touchpoint Program: A sustainable option for families by providing virtual resources and community partnership opportunities.
